

II. Our Office's Public Incident Handling Unit is a full-time allotted unit, whenever our Office's jurisdiction undergoes a sudden public incident or large public event, then the Secretary Section will approve the Duty Officer to report as needed to the Chief Prosecutor for approval, and responsive handling will conform to the provisions of Article 8 of the aforementioned Guidelines to support and uniformly coordinate efforts.

Our Office's Public Incident Handling Unit was established December 10 of the same year.

Chapter 5

Review Committee for Convicted Cases



I. Mission for establishment

To uncover the truth and avoid wrongful convictions, it is essential to establish a to review convicted cases mechanism, ensuring prosecutors exercise their duties objectively.

II. Organization and Structure

Our Office established the Review Committee for Handling Groups or Organizations Opinions on convicted cases, to

undertake a thorough review of the opinions of government agencies or groups on convicted cases, and where after the review of the Chief Prosecutor finds it necessary for further review, then the Review Committee for Convicted Cases convenes to consider the meeting. The Chief


Prosecutor acts as the Convenor to chair the meeting, and as indicated by the case, invites the relevant Prosecutors' Office Chief Prosecutor or their delegated Head Prosecutor, prosecutors, forensic medical examiners, forensic scientists, criminal law professors, lawyers, or retired members of the judiciary to participate in the Committee.

III. The status of final dispositions by our Office's handling of confirmed criminal case review efforts

From 2017 through June 2021, there were a total of 47 cases, of which 35 were closed by final disposition, among which 33 were determined after review to be denied for further relief, and motions for retrial were filed in 2 instances.

Our Office's handling of convicted case petitions for review are as follows in this Table
